

This is a clear sign to them of their destruction, but of your salvation, and that from God. ²⁹ For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake, ³⁰ engaged in the same conflict that you saw I had and now hear that I still have.

MINUTES OF THE LIVING HOPE ANNUAL MEETING

(January 18, 2026)

President Oster called the meeting to order the afternoon of January 18, 2026. Eight voters and Pastor Schaller were present.

Reports:

- ✓ Mr. Johannes read the minutes from the November 11, 2025, Quarterly Voters Meeting. Mr. Youngerberg moved to accept the minutes as read. The voters supported and approved the motion.
- ✓ Mr. Dumke presented the Treasurer's report for the 4th quarter and year of 2025.
- ✓ Mr. King presented the Financial Secretary's Report for the 4th quarter and year of 2025. Offering statements have been emailed and/or printed and in mailboxes at church. Student Aid fund has been reallocated based on member updates.

President Oster thanked the men for their reports.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Schaller updated the voters on current classes and outreach to newer members and those that were having classes previously with Pastor Ude. He has also been updating the website with the weekly bulletin and FDL's service link.

Committee Updates: School Exploration: no updates at this time

Building and Grounds: Roof replacement and Carpet cleaning has been postponed until spring. The Door knobs for the front and back door have been replaced.

Outreach: No update at this time.

Unfinished Business:

Housing and Insurance allowance: The council recommended that we increase our housing allowance the last \$200 to be up to date in preparation for a new pastor. A motion was made and approved by the voters to increase the housing allowance by that amount (\$1,550 per month to \$1,750).

New Business

Mr. Dumke presented the proposed budget for 2026. He mentioned that the number are a bit skewed since we currently don't have a full-time pastor. The voters moved to approve and accepted the proposed budget. Mr. Dumke was thanked for his work on this.

CBP Estimate. The council recommended that we set our CBP estimate the same as last year at \$5,500 as we did meet that amount as of the end of June. Motion was made to keep it at \$5,500 and was approved. Pastor Schaller will send this estimate to the CLC.

Lent Schedule. In the event we do not have a full-time pastor for lent the midweek and holy week services were discussed. Coordinating with Pastor Schaller the following was decided: Ash Wednesday service on Thursday night at 6:30PM. No midweek lent services (Pastor Schaller noted that he would be participating in a pulpit exchange for midweek Lenten services) Good Friday Evening service at 6:30 PM (FDL has Maundy Thursday evening service and Good Friday afternoon service) Easter would be at normal time (2PM) with brunch possibly before.

Council Election

The nomination list for the open council position due to the end of Mr. Kings' term was Mark King, Craig Youngerberg, James Harper, Dan Barthels. No further names were put forth. After two rounds of voting, Mr. King was reelected for another three-year term.

Other:

Items on hold during vacancy: Little Free Library, Depression Seminar, CDF Seminar

Reminder:

Mr. Dumke moved to adjourn the meeting. The voters supported and approved the motion. The Voters meeting of Living Hope Lutheran Church adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

"THIS SUNDAY IS CALLED 'SEPTUA-WHAT?'"

When the pastor organizes the worship service he uses what is called a Pericope (meaning literally: 'a cutting out') a set of verses that form one unit or thought. (FYI, we are following the Eisenach Pericope which was developed in 1896 to supplement the historic Scripture readings for each Sunday in the Church Year -- which are listed in the front of the Lutheran Hymnal).

This year our pericope has fewer Sundays after Epiphany and includes three pre-Lent Sundays: Septuagesima (meaning 70), Sexagesima (meaning 60) and Quinquagesima (you guessed it, meaning 50). These number names do not designate exact periods of time until Easter but are only general markers of time from Easter. Technically Speaking, from Septuagesima until the Saturday after Easter it is 70 days.

Septuagesima reminds of the 70 years of captivity that God's people underwent in Babylon. It urges us to begin the return journey from bondage to sin toward the Promised Land. This first Sunday pre-lent reminds us that it is God's grace alone which we can thank if we are called as His people.

How is My Mission Offering Used?



We are privileged to share in the work of God's Kingdom with our sister congregations in the Church of the Lutheran Confession (CLC).

Living Hope's Budget includes \$5,500.00 for the CLC General Fund. In addition to this, individual offerings that are designated for "Missions" are

also contributions to the *General Fund* of the CLC. These offerings support our mission of sharing the Gospel through Christian Education at Immanuel Lutheran High School, College and Seminary (Regents); supporting mission congregations and outreach in North America, Latin America, Asia, and Africa (Missions); supporting Christian Education and Publishing (Education and Publications); and funding the business expenses of our church body (Trustees).

Offerings to the CLC General Fund are budgeted for the various ministries that we have undertaken as a church body. The budgeted total offering revenue for this fiscal year (July 1, 2025 — June 30, 2026) is \$1,265,097.

Board of Regents — The CLC subsidizes the Christian education at Immanuel Lutheran High School, College, and Seminary (ILC) in Eau Claire. In this fiscal year, the total ILC operating budget is \$1,724,100. The synodical subsidy is 42% of the operating budget. The balance of the operating expenses are funded via student revenue. www.ilc.edu

Board of Missions — These funds are used to aid the work of the gospel in our domestic (1 congregation) and foreign mission fields. The CLC currently has three full-time missionaries. www.lutheranmissions.org

Board of Education and Publications — The Board of Education and Publications oversees various publishing projects, provides resources and encouragement in Christian education (including assisting congregations to start Christian Day Schools—see EduK8 Fund below), and it oversees the CLC websites and CLC Book House.

Board of Trustees — These funds support the administration of the financial affairs of the church body and the “Old Retirement Plan” of the CLC.

Additional Funds have been created to support various efforts in the CLC as offerings allow. None of your Mission offerings go to these funds, however, an offering can be designated for these funds at any time.

Mission Development Fund (MDF) — This fund finances various extra-budgetary projects and aid efforts. Examples of MDF projects: Bibles for missions, translations, exploratory mission work, bicycles, motorcycles.

Kinship supports orphans in India and Nepal as well as seminary students and pastors’ widows. Kinship also provides aid after natural disasters and for other humanitarian needs among our foreign missions.

Student Aid Fund (SAF) — This fund supports the grants, loans, and work-study offered to students at ILC in an effort to make the Christian education at ILC as affordable as possible.

ILC Improvement Fund (IIF) — These funds are used for larger maintenance and capital improvement projects on the ILC campus and its buildings.

Church Extension Fund (CEF) — These resources are loaned to congregations at low mortgage rates for building projects. Mortgage payments replenish the fund.

EduK8 Fund — A fund for Christian Education for the purpose of assisting CLC congregations in the establishment and ongoing support of Christian Day Schools.

Immanuel Lutheran College Building Fund — This fund is used to pay for new building projects on the campus of Immanuel Lutheran College, High School, and Seminary.

HOME DEVOTIONS FOR FEBRUARY 2-7, 2026

Monday – Matthew 8:23-27 Jesus could sleep in the middle of a terrible storm because even the wind and the sea obey Him (v27)! Such is the glory of God's own Son!

Tuesday – Romans 13:8-10 Following Christ does not mean we do not pay lawful debts, but Christian love goes beyond the mere payments owed and serves the best interest of one's neighbor.

Wednesday – Isaiah 43:1-3 Jesus embodied the promises of old, was with the disciples when they passed through the waters (v2), and saved mankind from the fire that their sins deserve.

Thursday - Psalm 97 When the LORD rules, that is surely something to celebrate, for His righteousness wins over all evil, and all the peoples see His glory (v6). He guards, delivers, and brings light and joy to His people.

Friday – Psalm 2:1-6 Why? Why-ever would the people and rulers of this world rage against the LORD who saves by His Christ? Thankfully they cannot stop Him from establishing His King on the throne.

Saturday – Psalm 2:7-12 The Son speaks of the Father's decree, very much like the announcement at Jesus' baptism and transfiguration: "This is my beloved Son!" How blessed are all who take refuge in Him (v12).
