JEREMIAH 8:4-9

EPISTLE:

1 CORINTHIANS 1:21-31

²¹ For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe. ²² For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, ²³ but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, ²⁴ but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵ For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.

⁴⁷ So the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered the council and said, "What are we to do? For this man performs many signs. ⁴⁸ If we let him go on like this, everyone will believe in him, and the Romans will come and take away both our place and our nation."

⁴⁹ But one of them, Caiaphas, who was high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing at all. ⁵⁰ Nor do you understand that it is better for you that one man should die for the people, not that the whole nation should perish." ⁵¹ He did not say this of his own accord, but being high priest that year he prophesied that Jesus would die for the nation, ⁵² and not for the nation only, but also to gather into one the children of God who are scattered abroad. ⁵³ So from that day on they made plans to put him to death.

⁵⁴ Jesus therefore no longer walked openly among the Jews, but went from there to the region near the wilderness, to a town called Ephraim, and there he stayed with the disciples.

⁵⁵ Now the Passover of the Jews was at hand, and many went up from the country to Jerusalem before the Passover to purify themselves. ⁵⁶ They were looking for Jesus and saying to one another as they stood in the temple, "What do you think? That he will not come to the feast at all?" ⁵⁷ Now the chief priests and the Pharisees had given orders that if anyone knew where he was, he should let them know, so that they might arrest him. *

The 2026 General Budget has been set by the Voters in our Annual Meeting at: \$120,120.00. We have thus far received: \$ 13,891.74 toward that budget.

FUNERAL OBITUARY

After having written more than 50 Funeral Obituaries, I have had a number of people ask me to write theirs in advance. If you would like the pastor to work on that for you, feel free to ask him.

“THIS SUNDAY IS CALLED ‘QUINQUA-WHAT?’”

This year our pericope has fewer Sundays after Epiphany and includes three pre-Lent Sundays: Septuagesima (meaning 70), Sexagesima (meaning 60) and Quinquagesima (you guessed it, meaning 50). These number names do not designate exact periods of time until Easter but are only general markers of time from Easter. It is roughly 50 days from Quinquagesima until Easter Week.

Quinquagesima historically pictures our Savior Jesus in His way up to Jerusalem. His disciples follow with fear and anxiety. He alone can see. He alone knows the goal. But He graciously opens our blind eyes so that we may also ‘go up to Jerusalem’ with joyful, seeing eyes.

We are always in need of help in carrying out our worship service without an organist. If you’ve been thinking that you could help with the slides or the streaming service and would like to learn how to do it, please speak with Mr. Rodney Kern.

PASTORAL SHORTAGE IN THE CLC

Please pray that the Lord Jesus provide workers for our CLC Pulpits. Most recently Pastor John Hein retired for health reasons (cancer), leaving Grace Lutheran in Fridley MN without a pastor. Pastor Richard Kanzenbach has recently announced his intention to retire in the summer of 2026, which will leave St. Luke's Lutheran Church in Lemmon, SD without a pastor. Pastor Ted Barthels has also announced his retirement from the pastoral ministry April 30th, 2026.

As it stands now, we have or will have 8 churches, 9 openings in the pastoral and teaching ministry: 1) Grace in Fridley MN; 2) Trinity in Spokane WA; 3) Holy Cross in Phoenix AZ; 4) Our Redeemer's in Red Wing MN; 5) St. Luke's in Lemmon, SD; 6) Messiah in Eau Claire, WI; 7) Living Hope of Appleton, WI; 8) St. Paul's Ev. Lutheran in Austin, MN; 9) ILC is short a professor. We anticipate 1 graduate from Seminary in the next 3 years and we have 21 Pastors and Professors over 60 years old, 19 that are over 65 and 9 that are over 70 years of age. There are 14 men in the Pre-Theology Program at ILC, but it will take at least 7 years to graduate them...if they continue. We may have a shortage for at least the next decade. We have 50 pastors serving 65 congregations in the CLC. But don't think that this is an issue facing only the CLC. In the CLC, 11% of our congregations have vacancies. In the WELS they are also at 11%. The LCMS is at 20% and the ELCA seems to be much higher, for every 200 pastors that are graduated, 400 retire. What is the point of all this? Be thankful that you have a pastor and pray that God moves other men to serve.

LENTEN WORSHIP

This Wednesday, February 18th is Ash Wednesday and marks the beginning of the 40-day penitential season of Lent. The Lenten Series chosen this year is entitled: "Return to the Lord your God." This season we will focus on God's call to His people to repent and remove the things that could get in the way of our returning to God. It is God's desire to be our God and for us to be His people. The themes are: A Call to Return, Return to Prayer, Return from Betrayal, Return from False Witness, Return from Denial, Return to the Kingdom of God, Return to the Table (Maundy Thursday), Return to Truth (Good Friday).

Our Lenten Theme includes a pulpit rotation with our sister congregations: Ascension Lutheran in Batavia IL (Chicago), Messiah Lutheran in Hales Corners (Milwaukee), and Peace Through Christ in Middleton (Madison).

General Fund – The positive balance in the General Fund increased slightly this month and now sits at about \$16,000, which is \$20,000 ahead of last year.

ILC Operations – January, the first month of the second semester at ILC, is generally a good month for revenue and this year is no exception. Revenues were about \$50,000 more than disbursements, increasing the ending balance by that amount.

Kinship – Contributions continue to be strong and are up 54% over the same period last year.

Church Extension Fund – Year to date revenue consists of regular monthly payments received from congregations on loans they owe the CLC and a lump-sum payoff of one loan for a total of about \$347,000. Revenue also includes \$167,000 from increases in the market value of the investments. Disbursements include \$559,000 loaned to a member congregation for their building project.

EduK8 Fund – Another \$10,000 was disbursed in January to assist one of our Christian day schools.

Other Auxiliary Funds – The activity in the other funds in the table above is similar to the activity in the same period a year ago.

READINGS FOR DEVOTIONS FEBRUARY 16-21, 2026

Monday – Matthew 17:1-9 With Jesus on the mountain, Peter, James, and John beheld the Lord's glory as He spoke with Moses and Elijah. His face and clothing shined, but His word was what they should listen to.

Tuesday - 2 Peter 1:16-21 Years later Peter still remembers the Lord's heavenly majesty on that special mountain, but he points us to the prophetic word, which is like a lamp shining in a dark place (v19).

Wednesday – Matthew 6:16-18 *Ash Wednesday.* As we prepare for Easter with a season of penitence, may fasting and all our customs be acts of repentance and thanksgiving, not mere shows to gain earthly honor.

Thursday - Matthew 6:19-21 There are treasures on earth and there are treasures in heaven. Those in heaven outlast anything on earth, are far more worthy of our heart's desire, and freely ours in Christ.

Friday - Isaiah 59:12-21 Our many sins are in fact rebellion against the Lord (vv12-15). The LORD sees there is none to work salvation, so His own arm will work salvation for Zion (vv16-21). Thanks be to God!

Saturday – Psalm 51 As we recognize with David our need for cleansing, we turn to a gracious God, asking Him to create a clean heart within us (v12), that our joy in His salvation may be shared with other sinners (v13).
